**QUALIFICATIONS:**

**REQUIRED:** A doctoral degree in school psychology (or will be conferred by September 2009),

preferably from an APA accredited program, or from a closely allied discipline.

**PREFERRED:** Have the ability to work collaboratively with community schools and agencies; teach courses in assessment, consultation, interventions and professional issues; supervise student field placements and theses; and conduct an active research program. Preferred credentials include eligibility for licensure as a psychologist and certification as a school psychologist in New York State, certification as a Nationally Certified School Psychologist, and two years experience working as a school psychologist.
